

PREFACE

Jamaica conducted its Fourteenth Census of Population and Housing in 2011. Under the provisions of the Statistics Act, the Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN) is vested with the authority to conduct any census in Jamaica. The census plays an essential role in all elements of the national statistical system, including the economic and social components. Census statistics are used as benchmarks for statistical compilation or as a sampling frame for household sample surveys. The national statistical system of almost every country relies on sample surveys for efficient and reliable data collection. Without the sampling frame derived from the population and housing census, the national statistical system would face difficulties in providing current reliable official statistics.

While recognizing the importance of the census however, countries are faced with serious resource constraints. Census taking in Jamaica faces not only the challenge of limited resources but an apathetic public which views official data collection with suspicion and even hostility. Despite a vibrant publicity programme for Census 2011, the level of cooperation particularly in some urban centres was disappointing. Worker attitude also presented problems as in a number of cases workers had to be relieved of their duties due to poor and or unproductive work. There was not always sufficient recognition of the fact that remuneration was for work done.

The processing of the census returns is a massive undertaking for which STATIN sought to utilize modern technology for this phase. The data processing of the questionnaires was out-sourced to XSOMO International Ltd., who was required to produce the electronic data in a database format and images of the questionnaires. Scanning of the forms which began in June 2011 ended on January 31, 2012. The data editing and cleaning were done using software developed internally and shared via the intranet. The validity and consistency checks which follow will continue until a full and clean database is produced. As the process continues, reports on those topics for which checks are completed, will be produced. At a later date, The Statistical Institute will entertain requests for unpublished data according to stipulated procedures and conditions.

This report is one in the series of subject reports which will provide tabulations based on the specific topics covered on the census questionnaire, at varying geographic levels. This report presents tabulations on Fertility and Mortality. Tabulations are presented at the parish level.

Among the reports to be published is a separate report for each parish which brings together tables on all topics in one volume.

BACKGROUND TO THE CENSUS

Legal Authority for the Census

The 2011 Population and Housing Census was taken under the provisions of the Statistics (Amendment) Act 1984. In accordance with Section 4 of the Statistics Act, the House of Representatives approved the Census Order, 2011 on January 5, 2011. This Order authorized the taking of a Population and Housing Census in Jamaica between April 5 and December 31, 2011. Also, under Section 6 of the Act, the Minister of Finance and Planning made the Census Regulations, 2011 on January 5, 2011. These Regulations outlined the conditions under which the census was to be conducted.

Coverage, Design and Methodology

Censuses of population are generally conducted on either a 'de facto' or 'de jure' basis. A 'de facto' census seeks to determine the number and characteristics of the population present in an area at the time of the census. The 'de jure' census identifies the population usually resident in the area whether physically present or not, at the time of the census. The 2011 census, like all since 1943, was conducted on a 'de jure' basis. The 'de jure' count includes all persons, Jamaicans and non-Jamaicans whose usual place of residence was in Jamaica even if they were temporarily (less than six months) abroad at the time of the census.

The following groups were excluded:

- (i) All Jamaicans (including diplomatic personnel) who were away from the country for six months or more;
- (ii) All visitors to Jamaica who are usual residents of other countries; and
- (iii) All foreign diplomatic personnel located in Jamaica.

One questionnaire was developed for use in the census to collect information from households (Appendix II – Form PC011A) and one for individuals (Appendix III – Form PC011B). The data collecting method utilised was the "Interviewer Method". One census taker was assigned to each enumeration district (the smallest census geographic area) to list every building in the area assigned. Where the building was found to be the living quarters of an individual or a group of individuals the form was completed for each household and each person. Each census taker worked with a household form and an individual form. Consideration was also given to the enumeration of persons who live in institutions as well as persons who were located on the streets and this was taken into account in the design.

The census design also included a Post Enumeration Survey planned as a coverage assessment tool. The Post Enumeration Survey was conducted during

the period September 7-30, 2011 in all parishes and covered a 5 per cent sample of census EDs. A total of 286 EDs were eventually canvassed.

The Institutional Population

All institutions, which could be regarded as the usual residence of the inhabitants either because they had no other residence or because they were 'long-term' residents, were included. General hospitals, public and private were therefore generally excluded. The treatment of the institutional population as regards the questions asked was determined by the accessibility of the persons resident to the interviewer. Where no access was possible, only age and sex data were retrieved from administrative records. Where access was possible, the entire individual questionnaire was administered. Trainees and students of all educational institutions were canvassed with the individual questionnaire.

If an institution contained separate quarters for staff members, caretakers, etc., these quarters were treated as private dwellings.

Types of Institutions

- (i) Convents and Monasteries
- (ii) University and College Residences
- (iii) Hostels and Residences for Trainees and/or Graduate Teachers, Nurses and Ministers of Religion
- (iv) Military Camps, Police Training Schools and Police Barracks
- (v) Boarding Schools and Other Residential Schools
- (vi) Correctional Institutions, Penitentiaries, Prisons, Rehab Centres, Iuvenile Institutions
- (vii) Mental Institutions
- (viii) Homes for Children/Aged/Infirm/Needy
- (ix) Hospitals and Homes providing specialized care
- (x) Hospitals and Homes for the Blind, Deaf and Other Handicapped

Persons on the Streets

This group comprises persons who may or may not be usual residents of a private or non-private dwelling. Area Managers were instructed to familiarise themselves with the locations where such persons tend to frequent for purposes of sleeping, and obtain as much information as possible. Locations included bus parks, markets, drains and sidewalks. Some persons were also identified by charity organizations which provide daily meals for such persons.

The Scope of the Census

The United Nations Principles and Recommendations guided all technical considerations including the choice of topics. The topics included on the census questionnaire were as follows:

Geographic Division of Jamaica for Census Purposes

Jamaica was divided into 5,776 geographic units called enumeration districts (EDs) for the purpose of data collection during the 2011 Population and Housing Census (see Appendix I). Each ED is an independent unit which shares common boundaries with contiguous EDs. The number of dwellings/households contained in the ED (estimated before the census) was the primary determination

of the size of an ED. This was approximately 150 dwellings/households in urban areas and 100 in rural areas. Each ED was designed to be of a size that would ensure an equitable work load for each census taker, and because dwellings are more widely spaced in rural areas than in urban areas, rural EDs usually contained fewer dwellings/households than their urban counterpart. When grouped together, enumeration districts reconstitute larger divisions; special area, constituency and the parish.

Field Organization

For administrative purposes the island was divided into 7 Regions, 62 Coordinator Areas and 1,029 Supervisory Zones. A central Census Office was established in the Kingston Metropolitan Area (KMA). Seven Regional Managers who were selected from STATIN's permanent field supervisors operated from offices in the KMA, Linstead, May Pen, Black River and Montego Bay. Each of the 62 Area Coordinators maintained an office in a central location in the area. The field organization operated under the direction of the Director of Field Services.

Field Enumeration

Field enumeration started slowly on April 5, 2011 as many Census Takers had not been issued identification cards. For an identification card to be issued, the Area Coordinator must have completed the selection process and submit the relevant information to the head office where checks had to be made to verify the training location of the individual. Photographs for identification were stored by training sites so this information had to be retrieved to request the identification from the service providers.

The collection process limped for the first three weeks of April and returns were slow. Census takers began to express dissatisfaction with what they considered late payments of Training Fees. By the beginning of May with such payments made, the pace of enumeration picked up somewhat but census workers again began agitating for payments of claims for travelling even in some instances with very little or no work done. The militancy continued as the problems with these first payments were resolved very close to the pay period. Some persons threatened to leave the job. At this time members of the senior staff of STATIN were kept busy responding to the media as they were approached by dissatisfied census workers.

A number of supervisors and census takers gave up the job while others were relieved because of non-performance but by the time that began to happen, there were persons available as replacements. The data collection phase ended on August 31, 2011.

Challenges of Data Collection

The main challenges encountered could be summarized in the following-

- the general hostility of the population with what was regarded as a 'government' project;
- the inability to relate their participation with immediate personal benefits;
- the belief that the information would be given to the tax collectors;
- violence in some areas and the inability to be out late at nights;
- incidents of dog bites;
- lack of access to gated communities;
- inefficient and unproductive census workers.

Fertility and Mortality in the 2011 Census

Introduction

The inclusion of fertility and mortality in population censuses is especially important for countries which lack an efficient system of vital statistics but even in countries with reliable systems, census data are extremely useful for measurement and analysis of vital events over time and for providing the type of data that are not easily available from registration systems. The census is a valuable source of data used in the construction of indirect methods for measuring fertility and mortality. The United Nations Principles and Recommendations (2008, 112) identify as core topics, 'children ever born alive', 'children living' and 'household deaths in the past 12 months'. Additional topics recommended are 'age of mother at birth at first and last child born alive,' 'age date or duration of first marriage or union' and 'maternal or paternal orphan hood', while topics recommended to be derived from the information collected are 'births in the past 12 months' and 'deaths among children born in the past 12 months'. The recommended target population for the fertility questions is all women of 15 years old and over regardless of marital status "unless from a cultural standpoint it is not feasible to collect information on childbearing from never-married women." An important point noted in the recommendations is that countries that do not use the data for women 50 years of age and over may limit the data collection to women under age 50 years.

'Children ever born alive' is widely used for the estimation of fertility and child mortality. As explained (United Nations, 1983) the number of children ever born to a particular woman is an aggregate measure of her lifetime fertility experience up to the moment at which the data are collected. The proportion of children ever born who have died is an indicator of child mortality.

Unfortunately however collecting census data on fertility and mortality is very problematic. Limitations present themselves for a number of reasons. In most cases accurate responses on fertility require direct interviews with the respondents and not the proxy reporting which is the norm in census taking. Additionally, the questions require a level of probing not possible in the census because they are time consuming and more suitable for use in sample surveys than in censuses.

Reporting errors are common as children are sometimes omitted. Children who have left home or who have died are especially likely to be omitted. Attempts to refine the process by including questions on survivorship and on sex are not always successful as the addition of questions on these personal aspects of a

woman's life often times results in non-response. Sex of the children is a topic which is subject to a high degree of missing cases. The total number of children ever born should be the sum of the number of males and the number of females. Inconsistent reporting and recording however, yields tables which do not reflect this. Interviewer error is also an important factor influencing data quality. For example, the failure to follow instructions which state that a zero should be recorded for women who have had no children will result in a blank space which is interpreted as 'not stated' in the processing.

One obvious source of deficiency in reporting household deaths is in cases where such deaths result in the disintegration of households as in the case of persons living alone.

The limitations recognized mean that generally all estimates of fertility and mortality derived from the census are approximate and subject to all types of error. "In general the data in the basic tabulations resulting from these questions should not be used for the direct calculation of fertility and mortality rates. Reliable estimation of fertility and mortality levels using census data requires adjustment based on methods of demographic analysis" (United Nations, 2008, 142).

The Jamaican Census Experience in Collecting Statistics related to Fertility and Mortality in Censuses

Jamaica has a long history of including questions on fertility and mortality in censuses beginning with the census of 1943. Over time however, the target population has changed, as has the focus of the questions. An important consideration in determining census topics is the probable willingness of the public to provide information. The census experience has demonstrated over the years, an increasing unwillingness on the part of the Jamaican public to respond to questions on fertility. Fertility questions have always been asked of women only. The age range of the target population has changed over time. In 1943 the target population was 10 years and over. Beginning in 1960 and continuing until 1991 the questions focused on women 14 years and over who were not attending primary or secondary school full-time. Full-time students attending university were included. Resistance to the questions from the older women emerged during the 1982 census so for 1991 questions were restricted to the 14-64 years old group. This still presented problems and for 2001 the upper age limit was set at 49 years. For 2011 this upper limit was retained and the lower limit was raised from 14 years to 15 years.

Questions on live born children ever had, age at birth of first and last live born and births in the past 12 months have been the most consistently included in all censuses. It is of interest to note that questions on fertility and union status on the census questionnaire are linked. George Roberts (1957, 1975) has written extensively on Fertility and Mating Patterns in the region. His seminal work on Fertility and Mating in Four West Indian territories including Jamaica is based largely on the 1960 censuses of Barbados, Jamaica, St Vincent and Trinidad and Tobago. According to Roberts (1957, 263) the diverse mating patterns observed in Caribbean societies has meant that fertility cannot realistically be studied within the context of legal marital status only. Consequently beginning with the 1943 census in a limited way, and expanded since 1960, a clear distinction between marital status and union status (in respect of women only) was introduced and has been included in censuses ever since. Although fertility questions are still restricted to women, union status questions have been directed to men since 2001.

Explanation of Fertility and Mortality Categories

Children Ever Born/Born Alive

This includes all natural children born alive (that is to say excluding foetal deaths) during the lifetime of the woman up to the census date. The number recorded should include all live-born children, whether born in or out of marriage, whether born in the present or a prior marriage, or in a de-facto union, or whether living or dead at the time of the census.

Children Living

The living children include those living with the mother in the household and those living elsewhere, no matter where they may reside and regardless of their age and marital status.

Births Occurring in the Past 12 Months and Deaths among those Births

These are occurrences in the 12 months preceding the census that is between April 4, 2010 and April 3, 2011. The deaths are deaths of the babies born during that period.

Household Deaths

Provision was made on the household questionnaire for a question which asked if any member of this household had died since January 1, 2010. If the answer was 'yes' a record was made of the number by sex. For each death the sex, age, month and year of death and code for the cause was recorded. Cause of Death was identified in six (6) broad categories as Violence, Accident, Suicide, Natural Causes and Other.

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Notes to the Tables

- 1. Summary of Population Counts:
 - (i) Population in private dwellings identified from manual records: 2,553,949
 - (ii) Population enumerated in Institutions: 18,420
 - (iii) Population enumerated on the streets: 934
 - (iv) Total population identified from manual records: 2,573,303
 - (v) Number of dwellings identified as occupied but no contact made with residents: 97,000
 - (vi) Population completing questionnaire: 2,214,341
 - (vii) Final population count adjusted for undercount: 2,697, 983
- 2. The tables in this report are based on the adjusted data. The adjustments were guided by the use of standard demographic analysis based on the 2001 census count and vital statistics for the intercensal period. This was supplemented in part by findings of the Post Enumeration Survey conducted immediately following the main enumeration.
- 3. Adjustment factors based on age and sex for each parish have been applied to the enumerated population.
- 4. Adjustment factors are calculated to 5 decimal places. The final adjusted figures are rounded to the nearest ten.
- 5. Rounding may cause minor discrepancies between totals and the sums of the component parts of a table.
- 6. The census tabulations are based on different population groups, determined by the questions posed to these groups. The tabulations on Fertility are based on a total population of **732,697** representing women 15-49 years old and resident in private households.
- 7. The universe for these tables is determined by the responses to the questions posed. The groups of women identified, are as follows:

Question – Have you ever had live born children?

• Total Women 15-49 years responding yes or no – 699,501.

Question (if yes) – How many children and of what sex? Total identified as having one or more children-451,112 of which 449,895 stated the exact total, 449,777 stated the exact number of male children and 448,838 stated the exact number of female children.

- Due to inconsistency in reporting the sex distribution of the children the total number of children born alive (Table 2.1) is not the sum of the total male children born alive (Table 2.2) and the total female children born alive (Table 2.3).
- The calculations for the total number of live born are based on women stating the exact number of children only.
- 8. The data on household deaths are derived from the household questionnaire which covers private households only.
